NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS CONCERNING THE CONTINUED CLOSURE OF THE BOROUGH BUILDING TO PUBLIC ACCESS AND INSISTENCE ON USING THE TUBE.

The Borough of Woodlynne continues to stay closed to public because of COVID-19 and the COVID-19 Variance.

Our Borough's daily business continues to operate through the tube located outside and in the front of the Borough building. The Borough offices are in the basement except the mayor's office that is on the first floor (same level as the Borough Hall). However, none of the offices have access to a window, and as such makes it subject to non-containment should any virus infection become present or released within the basement area. COVID-19 and its variances are deadly virus based on the scientific evidence and we want to be very careful to protect the employees and our community at large. With the above explanation we continue to remain close till the COVID-19 and its variances become very insignificant.

As at today, November 7, 2021, Woodlynne continues to register an average of about 4 to 6 cases per week.

Although sometimes you see scheduled activities going on within the first floor, note that such activities are controlled activities with minimum number of people in the area at one time, all attendees wearing mask, and attendees following additional protocols as approved by CDC and the New Jersey Department of health.

We will continue to monitor the situation and will provide updates when necessary.
